

The regular meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order by Mayor Hoppough, in the Council Chambers, in the Municipal Complex located at 415 S. Lafayette Street, Greenville, Michigan 48838 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Mayor Hoppough; Councilpersons Lehman, Scoby, Warner, Moss, Cunliffe and Schuleit; City Manager Bosanic; Public Safety Director Reiss; and Clerk-Treasurer Rasmussen.

Absent: None.

Public Comments: None.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: The Consent Agenda be approved as presented. Councilperson Schuleit seconded. Unanimously adopted.

The Consent Agenda consisted of the following:

1. Approval of minutes for the regular City Council meeting held August 2, 2016.
2. Approval of payroll report for regular payroll report for pay period ending July 29, 2016 in the amount of \$115,605.76. Approval of accounts payable report for period ending August 10, 2016 in the amount of \$237,589.89.
3. Approval of minutes for the regular Downtown Development Authority meeting held July 12, 2016.
4. Approval of minutes for the regular Planning Commission meeting held July 14, 2016.

Council recognized five members from the Department of Public Safety for years of service.

Council considered the award of a bid for the purchase of turnout gear for the Department of Public Safety.

Councilperson Schuleit MOVED: To award a bid for the purchase of 3 sets of turnout gear for the Public Safety Department to 5 Alarm Inc. of Deerfield, Wisconsin in the amount not to exceed \$6,318.00 as presented. Councilperson Lehman seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered the approval of a Restrictive Covenant in connection with the Admiral Station located at 1305 West Washington Street.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To consent to the proposed Restrictive Covenant for property located at 1305 West Washington Street as presented and authorize the Mayor to sign on behalf of the City. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.

City Manager's Comments:

City Manager Bosanic updated the City Council on City Attorney Mullendore's retirement in September. The City Attorney Committee recommended that the City solicit for proposals for the prosecuting attorney position and select and interim for 60 days.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To authorize the City Manager to select interim legal counsel to provide prosecution services on a short-term basis (60 days) and to authorize the City Manager to solicit for proposals for prosecution services on a long term basis within 60 days/through October. Councilperson Schuleit seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Councilperson Cunliffe MOVED: The meeting be adjourned. Councilperson Moss seconded. Unanimously adopted.
