

The regular meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order by Mayor Hoppough, in the Council Chambers, in the Municipal Complex located at 415 S. Lafayette Street, Greenville, Michigan 48838 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Mayor Hoppough; Councilpersons Lehman, Cunliffe, Greene, Moss and Scoby; City Manager Bosanic; Clerk-Treasurer Hool.

Absent: Schuleit (excused).

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: The Consent Agenda be approved as presented with the removal of Item K for further discussion. Councilperson Greene seconded. Motion adopted with a vote of four ayes and two nays.

The Consent Agenda consisted of the following:

Council received comment on an ordinance to approve a major amendment to the Hathaway Green Planned Unit Development (PUD), concerning Crescent View Village.

Mayor Hoppough opened the public hearing at 7:57 p.m. and after receiving no comments closed the public hearing at 7:58 p.m.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To approve the proposed Ordinance No. 15-01 to approve a major amendment to the Hathaway Green Planned Unit Development concerning Crest View Village and the proposed Superseding PUD Agreement for Hathaway Green as presented. Councilperson Scoby seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered the approval of an ADA Complaint Policy in connection with the Transit Department.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To approve the proposed Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Complaint Policy as presented.

WHEREAS, the Michigan Department of Transportation has requested all transit agencies adopt an ADA Complaint Policy; and

WHEREAS the City of Greenville Transit operates a non-urban, demand-response transit system within the city boundaries. As a condition of receiving Federal Transit Administration financial assistance from the U.S. Department of Transportation to operate these services, transit agencies must ensure that their programs, policies, and activities comply with the Title II and III of the American Disability Act of 1990 (ADA); and

WHEREAS Title II and III of the American Disability Act of 1990 (ADA) provides that no entity shall discriminate against an individual with a disability in connection with the provision of transportation services; and

WHEREAS the law sets forth specific requirements for vehicle and facility accessibility and the provision of service, including access to fixed bus route and complementary paratransit service; and

WHEREAS Greenville Transit is committed to providing safe and reliable transportation to all people without discrimination based on disabilities; and

WHEREAS the City of Greenville has added the necessary Greenville Transit ADA Complaint Policy to ensure we have procedures for processing ADA related complaints that comply with ADA record retention requirements and to be up-to-date with the requirements of MDOT;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: The City of Greenville approves the proposed Americans with Disabilities Act (Greenville Transit ADA Complaint Policy as presented.

Councilperson Greene supported. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered a request to close certain streets and a portion of the Fred Meijer Flat River Trail in connection with the Yellow Jacket Challenge.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: To approve certain street closures and a portion of the Fred Meijer Flat River Trail as follows:

Street Closures:

- Yellow Jacket Drive – from Greenville West Drive to Hillcrest Street.
- Blackburn Street.
- Southbound lane of Franklin Street – from the Fred Meijer Flat River Trail to Montcalm Street.
- Westbound lane of Montcalm – from Franklin Street to Hillcrest Street.
- Westerly southbound lane of Hillcrest Street – from Montcalm Street to Yellow Jacket Drive under traffic control while the race is in progress.

Fred Meijer Flat River Trail Closure:

- FMFRT – from Hillcrest Street to Franklin Street.

Councilperson Scoby supported. Unanimously adopted.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: The meeting be adjourned. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.
