

The regular meeting of the Greenville City Council was called to order by Mayor Hoppough, in the Council Chambers, in the Municipal Complex located at 415 S. Lafayette Street, Greenville, Michigan 48838 at 7:30 p.m.

Present: Mayor Hoppough; Councilpersons Schuleit, Lehman, Cunliffe, Scoby, Moss, and Scoby; City Manager Bosanic; Clerk-Treasurer Hool; City Engineer Hinken.

Absent: Greene (excused).

Councilperson Moss MOVED: The Consent Agenda be approved as presented. Councilperson Schuleit seconded. Unanimously adopted.

The Consent Agenda consisted of the following:

1. Approval of minutes for the regular City Council meeting held March 3, 2015.
2. Approval of payroll report for regular pay period ending February 13, 2015 in the amount of \$113,715.75. Approval of accounts payable report for pay period ending March 10, 2015 in the amount of \$181,064.44.
3. Approval of minutes for the regular Downtown Development Authority meeting held February 10, 2015.
4. Approval of minutes for the regular Planning Commission meeting held February 26, 2015.

Council received comment on a grant application to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund on behalf of the Friends of the Fred Meijer River Valley Rail Trail in connection with the construction of approximately eleven (11) miles of non-motorized trail between Belding and Greenville.

Mayor Hoppough opened the public hearing at 7:43 p.m. and after receiving no comments closed the public hearing at 7:44 p.m.

Councilperson Scoby RESOLVED: WHEREAS, the City of Greenville supports the submission of an application titled, "Construction of Fred Meijer River Valley Rail - Trail North Phase" to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund for development of 11 miles of non-motorized rail trail beginning at Montcalm Ave. near 3-Mile Road and ending at Jacksons Landing Park in Greenville; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed application is supported by the Community's 5-Year Approved Parks and Recreation Plan; and,

WHEREAS, the Friends of the Fred Meijer River Valley Trails has made a financial commitment to the project in the amount of up to \$200,000 matching funds, in grants, cash and/or force account; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that City of Greenville hereby authorizes submission of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Application for \$290,000 during the 2015-2016 fiscal year. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council received comment on a grant application to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund in connection with a proposal to construct a skateboard park in Veteran's Memorial Park.

Mayor Hoppough opened the public hearing at 8:10 p.m. and after receiving no comments closed the public hearing at 8:11 p.m.

Councilperson Cunliffe RESOLVED: WHEREAS, the City of Greenville supports the submission of an application titled, "Veteran Park Skateboard/Tennis Area Improvements" to the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund for development of reconstruction and repurposing existing area to provide a skateboard park and one tennis court at Veteran's Park; and,

WHEREAS, the proposed application is supported by the Community's 5-Year Approved Parks and Recreation Plan; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that City of Greenville hereby authorizes submission of a Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Application for \$90,000 during, and further resolves to make available a local match through financial commitment and donation(s) of \$30,000 (25%) of a total \$120,000 project cost, the 2015-2016 fiscal year. Councilperson Lehman seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered the approval of a street closure request from the Greenville Area Chamber of Commerce in connection with the Annual Car Show.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To approve the request to close the following streets from 3:00 pm until 9:30 pm for the upcoming Car Show to be held Saturday, August 1, 2015, from 5:00 pm to 8:30 pm as presented:

- M-91 from Washington Street to Montcalm Street.
- Cass Street from Franklin Street to Clay Street.
- Grove Street from Franklin Street to Clay Street.

Councilperson Schuleit seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered the approval of certain street closures in connection with the annual Gus Macker Basketball Tournament to be held July 10-12, 2015.

Councilperson Lehman MOVED: To close M-91 (Lafayette Street) between M-57 (Washington Street) and Montcalm Street, Cass Street and Grove Street to the alley/parking lot entrances east and west of Lafayette Street on Friday, July 10, 2015, at 5:00 pm until Sunday, July 12, 2015, at 9:00 pm. Councilperson Schuleit seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Council considered a request for relief from the City's nuisance ordinance from the Relay For Life Organization.

Councilperson Schuleit MOVED: To approve the request from the American Cancer Society to grant relief from the City's Noise/Lighting section of the Nuisance Ordinance for 10:00 am June 12, 2015 to 10:00 am June 13, 2015 at the Greenville Public Schools High School in connection with the Relay For Life fundraising event as presented. Councilperson Scoby seconded. Unanimously adopted.

Councilperson Moss MOVED: The meeting be adjourned. Councilperson Cunliffe seconded. Unanimously adopted.
